## EASTER EGG HUNT - STALLS TO HIRE



In Class Rigil we built structures to work out how we could make them more strong, stable and stiff. We found that we needed to reinforce areas by attaching another beam from corner to corner.










In Art, Canopus have designed and made their own Viking coins using clay. The children used different tools to create different marks and textures in their coins.
